

## About Camp



The goals of Boerne Community Theatre's Summer Theatre Camps are to introduce our community's youth to the art of theatre and foster interest in the performing arts. Participation in theatre camp provides an excellent opportunity for campers to experiment with various components of acting and staging a production in a safe and encouraging environment. During summer theatre camp sessions, campers learn about and sharpen their skills in acting, singing, dancing, stage makeup application, theatre exercises, costuming, movement, vocal technique, audition and rehearsal procedures, character development, theatre etiquette, and technical theatre. Camp activities include arts and crafts, dress-up days, and other fun games and activities to reward campers for their hard work throughout the week. Campers benefit from both interaction and collaboration with their peers, and the opportunity to see the difference their individual talents make to the show. Additionally, theatre camp underscores the importance of teamwork and gives children the opportunity to establish lasting friendships, build confidence, create exciting memories and, most importantly, have fun this summer!



## Campers and Staff

Boerne Community Theatre's Summer Theatre Camps are open to 3<sup>rd</sup> through 9<sup>th</sup> graders, ages 8 to 14. All campers, regardless of their level of skill or prior experience, will feel challenged and accomplished with specific activities targeted to their age, experience and needs. Our program features an excellent camper/staff ratio to ensure that each camper receives individual attention and enjoys the experience as much as possible. Each of our dedicated and energetic staffers is college-trained in several aspects of performance and production including dance, voice, acting, directing and technical production, so you know your camper is receiving the most well-rounded, enjoyable, and professional performance opportunity in the Hill Country area!



## Pricing

The price per two-week session of theatre camp is just \$300. This price includes a camp t-shirt, script, camp supplies, show royalties, daily snacks, and a cast party. Payment is due at the time the application form is submitted, and refunds (less \$25 processing fee) will be given for cancellations up to two weeks prior to the start of camp. ## 2009 Camp Sessions

Campers must be able to attend camp every day and perform in all three performances on the final Friday evening, Saturday evening, and Sunday afternoon of camp in order to participate. Each camp session is Monday – Friday, 8:30 am – 4:30 pm.

### Session 1: Teens in Tinseltown

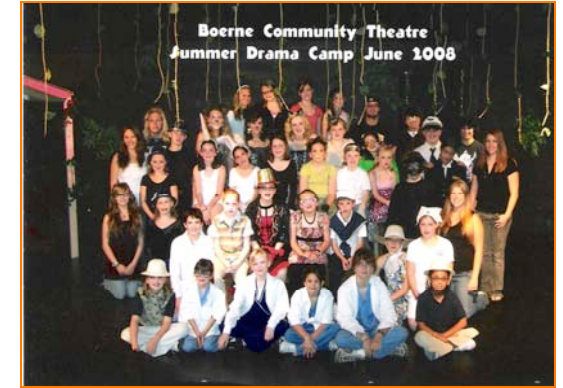
